At the beginning of November, the MSA Board of Directors held their annual fall meeting to review and confirm the Michi-

There were a number of notable decisions that the Board made that I want to pass along to you. The Board determined it was appropriate to hold the Michigan shooting fees at their current level of \$.02/target or \$2.00/100 targets for 2008. The NSSA fees will also stay the same next season. The 2008 Michigan State Championships will again be held at the wonderful facilities at the Detroit

Gun Club. We have added a sub-committee to develop and implement a web site for the MSA. That committee will be chaired by Trish Magyar and consist of Brent Edwards, Al Magyar, Jane Carpenter and Dave Keem. It will take some time to develop the site, but I'll keep you posted on our progress. If you have ideas for the site, please share them with one of the committee.

If you have an interest in running for the MSA Board of Directors in 2008, please let one of the Nominations and Elections Committee members know that no later than May 30, 2008. That committee is chaired by George Gilliam, and its members are Thelma Brown, Jane Carpenter, Tom Pavlack, Brent Edwards, and Dave Scott. That will ensure your name makes it onto the ballot that is mailed with your State Shoot registration form.

I'll close my portion of this issue by wishing all of you safe and Happy Holidays. And by reminding you that we all need to keep supporting our local gun clubs through the "robe season" so they will still be there for us in 2008 and beyond.

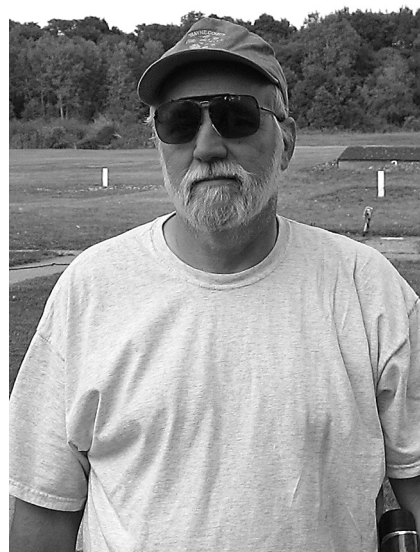

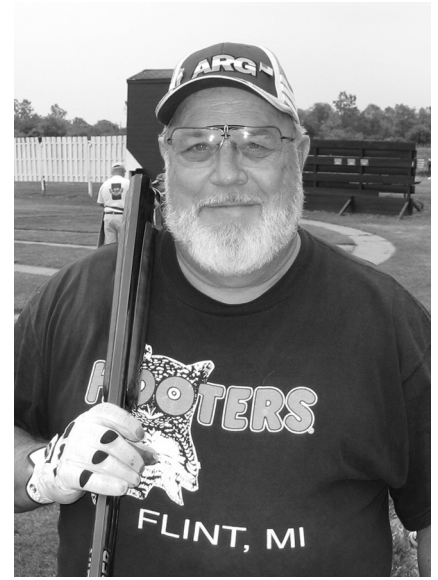

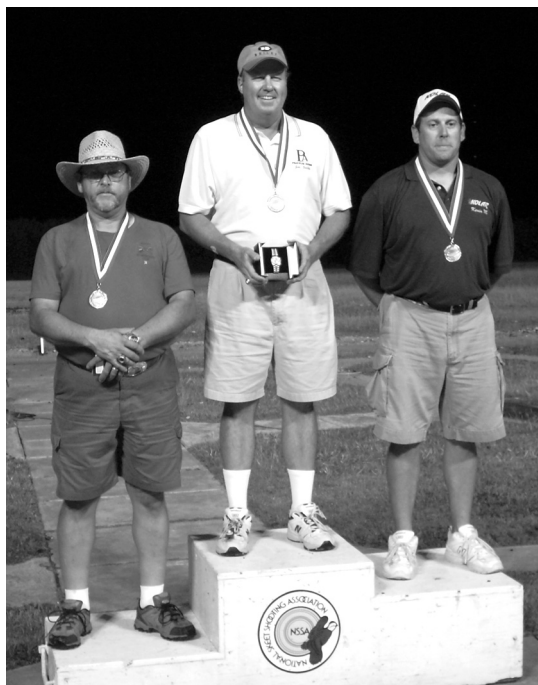

Dave Scott, from Grand Haven, who was attending his first NSSA Shoot at Wayne County Sportsman's Club, finished with the Events lone 100. Great shooting Dave. Our Event Runner Up was settled by a shoot off of 99's. Pat Wusthoff and Loraine Malloy took to the line, with Pat taking the shoot off and thus the Event Runner Up position. Class winners were as follows: AA1, Duane Lamley, 98; A1, Pete Pantalena, 97; B1, Loraine Malloy, 99; C1, Mark Fischer, 90; and Del Mahan, 88.

Saturday afternoon saw 37 shooters take to the line for the 20 gauge event, sponsored by Inland Waters Pollution Control. Duane Lamley secured the Event Championship with the Event's only 100 Straight. Three shooters with 99's shot off for event runner-up. They were Dave Scott, Bruce Christian, and Pat Wusthoff. Dave Scott, broke both his targets on 3, and finished as event runner up.

2007 Kastle Family/Scientific Notebook Charity Shoot

Walker Cup Prelim & Doubles

We have to figure out how he does it, but Scott Behnke and his dedicated staff seem to always be able to top the previous year's performance at the Kastle Family/Scientific Notebook Charity Shoot... Friday's weather, and for that matter the entire weekend, was unbelievable! Clear, blue skies every day, and NO white-puffy clouds! If you think I'm stretching the truth, I have the pictures to prove it. It was warmer than average, with some humidity thrown in, but a breeze made it all bearable and kept things interesting, to boot. There were four perfect scores in the Friday morning 75-bird "Event 6" Walker Cup with the .410, in which the top ten shooters compete for a beautiful Waterford Crystal trophy. But, as you will learn, the shoot-off isn't conducted under the "usual" rules. The remaining six spots were determined in a shoot-off of 11 74s after the Doubles event was completed. In the afternoon, everyone took to the fields for the Doubles Event, in which four shooters managed to break 100s. The competitors were eager to prove who was the best and gave each other a run for their money – all four ran the first box of doubles at 3, 4 and 5; and it took nearly another round to settle all places with Hayes Wauford emerging as Cham-

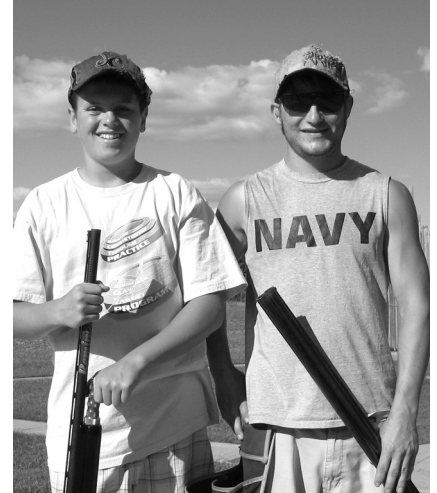

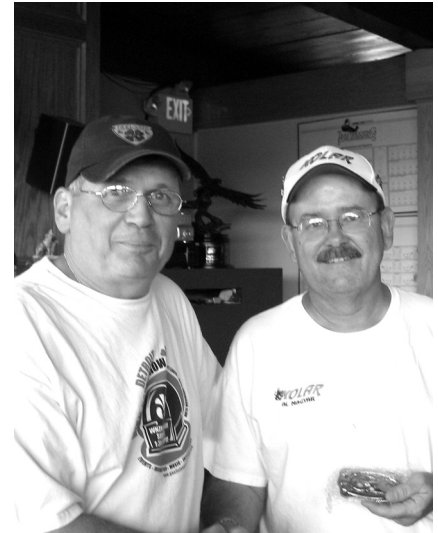
