of 1,200; 1,000; 1,000; 1,000; and 500. To be eligible for the Michigan All State Teams until further notice the amounts required are: 12Gauge, 1,000 targets; 20 Gauge, 28 Gauge and .410 are 800 targets; Doubles, 500. The MSA may change these in the future.

The Next Board of Directors meeting will be held in November at Saginaw Gun Club.



Michigan Skeet Association Club of the Year – 2011

Rick Trawinski, from Detroit Sportsmen's Congress, proposed to the Board that MSA recognize a "Club of the Year." The Board of Directors felt the most objective measure would be the greatest increase in registered targets from one year to the next, since

we want to promote more registered shooting. The Board approved the following guidelines (below) for awarding the MSA Club of the Year.

The 2011 MSA Club of the year is Kent County Conservation League with a 189.91% increase

in targets. The second place finisher was Saginaw Gun Club with a 52.16% increase; and in third place, Grayling Sportsmen's Club with a 51.94% increase. The award for the "Club of the Year" will be presented at the 2012 State Shoot. Congratulations to everyone!

MICHIGAN SKEET ASSOCIATION - CLUB OF THE YEAR

This achievement award is given to the MSA member club that has the greatest increase of registered targets thrown from the previous year to the next year.



Award will be based on percentage of increase, not the raw number of targets thrown.



Club of the year time period will be defined same as NSSA year:

- Start on November 1 of a shoot year.
- End on October 31 the following year.



Unique events will not be "counted" towards the total, such as but not limited to:

- Zone 3 event
- SCTP events



Member Club must have thrown registered targets two consecutive years in a row.



Presentation of the Award will be given to the member club at the Michigan State Skeet Championships.



Award will be based on results of the previous completed year, for example:

The 2011 award will be based on 2011 results but presented at the 2012 Michigan State Skeet Championships.

2012 Class All American Teams Congratulations to our 17 Winners in Michigan!

Class All-American Teams have replaced Class All-Zone Teams and provide more opportunity for individual shooter recognition. The points race is updated regularly on this page so shooters know their standings in the race throughout the year.

Calculation is objective, based on numbers only. The first requirement for eligibility is that NSSA minimum registered target standards must be shot: 800 12-gauge; 500 20-gauge, 28-gauge, and .410 bore; and 300 doubles targets. Targets must be shot at registered shoots or in registered leagues to count for this recognition.

Points are awarded based on the number of competitors in each class in a shoot, eliminating geographical differences, and are awarded at registered shoots as follows:

- 100 % of the class points listed below are awarded if there are 50 or more shooters in the class in attendance.
- 75 % of the class points are awarded if there are between 30 and 49 shooters in the class in attendance.
- 50 % of the class points are awarded if there are between 10 and 29 shooters in the class in attendance
- 25 % of the class points are awarded if there are fewer than 10 shooters in the class in attendance.

Maximum points awarded:

- 100 points for class 1st in a 100-target event
- 75 points for class 2nd in a 100-target event
- 50 points for class 3rd in a 100 target event

Points are awarded proportionately based on the number of targets shot. For example, a 50-target event would provide 50 points for class 1st; 37 points for class 2nd; and 25 points for class 3rd.

Event Champion, runner-up and third will get 100 points in their class.

All shooters in classes AAA thru E are eligible if they are clas-

sified in the 4 guns (12, 20, 28, and .410) and have shot the Class All-American minimum targets, including the 300 Doubles targets. Here is how the program works:

- Selection will be based on HOA Class at the beginning of the shooting year. The calculation of the HOA for new shooters will be based on the first 5 events of the current year that are used to establish their classification in each of the 4 guns. Targets shot at these 5 events will also count towards the Class All American minimum target requirements.
- If you are selected for an Open All-American Team, you are not eligible for consideration. Selection for an All-American Concurrent Team is not a factor.

You could be selected for both teams.

- League class places will count and be included at the end of the year.
- Monthly targets will not be considered.
- There is no additional administrative burden for our clubs. The computer will automatically assign points based on reported class wins and places 2nd and 3rd
- There is no need to travel away from your local area. Shoot at your surrounding clubs and have an equal chance for consideration.
- Open All-American will be selected first, then Class All-

Americans to insure there is no duplication.

The following teams will be selected in classes AAA-E for a total of 245 shooters each year.

1st team – 10 shooters – Will receive Class All-American Team Pin and Patch, Recognition Certificate, and Letter of Congratulations.

2nd team – 10 shooters – Will receive Class All-American Team pin and Recognition Certificate.

Honorable Mention Team – 15 shooters – Will receive pin and certificate.

All will be listed in the annual Records Annual and in Skeet Shooting Review.

Michigan Skeet Association State Teams

Selection to all teams is based upon high average; All-State Team and Concurrent selection is based upon 4-gun HOA average. An individual can only be selected for one team. The order of precedence for selection, and number selected, are:

- 1. All-State Team 10
- 2. 12 Gauge Team 5
- 3. 20 Gauge Team 5
- 4. 28 Gauge Team − 5
- 5. .410 Team 5
- 6. Doubles Team 5
- 7. Concurrent 1 in each concurrent category (Senior Veteran; Veteran; Senior; Sub-Senior; Sub-Senior; Triple Sub; Lady; Junior; Sub-Junior; Rookie).

In order to be eligible for selection to an MSA State Team, the following criteria apply:

All-State Team: Individuals must have shot at least 1,000 12 gauge targets; 800 20 gauge targets; 800 28 gauge targets; 800 .410 targets; and 500 Doubles targets during the previous target year.

All-Gauge Teams: Individuals must have shot the minimum targets in at least 2 gauges or one gauge and doubles as follows: 1,000 12 gauge targets to be eligible for the 12 Gauge team; or 800 20 gauge targets to be eligible for the 20 Gauge team; or 800 28 gauge targets to be eligible for the 28 Gauge team; or 800 .410 targets to be eligible for the .410 team; or 500 Doubles targets to be eligible for the Doubles team during the previous target year.

<u>Concurrent:</u> With the exception of Senior Veteran, Sub-Junior and Rookie, individuals must have shot at least 1,000 12 gauge targets; 800 20 gauge

targets; 800 28 gauge targets; 800 .410 targets; and 500 Doubles targets during the previous target year. For Senior Veteran and Sub-Junior, 700 12 gauge targets, 500 20 gauge targets, 400 28 gauge targets, 400 .410 targets and 300 doubles targets are the minimums required. For Rookie 700 12 gauge targets, 500 20 gauge targets, 500 28 gauge targets, 500 .410 targets and 300 doubles targets are the minimums required for Rookie of the Year.

Additional requirement for all teams: If only the minimum number of required targets is shot, then all but 200 targets in each gauge/event must be "regular targets" (i.e., not "targets only"). For each 50 or 100 targets above the required "regular targets," "targets only" are allowed. However, no "targets only" shot after the Michigan State Skeet Championships will be used for determining an individual's eligibility unless they are needed to make the minimum target requirements.



Michigan's Ten Best! "All State Team"

After a very successful new format, starting in 1997, that calls for no individual to appear on more than one team, the Michigan Board of Directors voted on continuation of this system to elect Michigan Teams. The 10 All-Staters will be on that team only. Then in order, according to gun averages, the five highest shooters in each of the four gauges and doubles, followed by the Concurrent H.O.A. winners. To qualify for the "All-State Team," members had to shoot the National "Standards" of 1,200-12 gauge, and 1,000 each of 20, 28, .410 and 500 doubles. They will be listed on the plaque in our Hall of Fame at the Detroit Gun Club. will receive belt buckles and certificates and will receive the right to wear our *Josten made "All-State" ring. The team in order of averages is listed below: (Please note: Due to the economy the "standards" were reduced both Nationally and in Michigan. The National Skeet Association has returned to the original "standards" in 2012. Until further notice the MSA will keep these reduced standards: 12 Gauge: 1,000; 20, 28 & .410: 800; and Doubles: 500).


